

Taking Care of Your Keyboard

- Always lay the case down flat with the writing facing upwards before you unpack your instrument.
- Keep your instrument away from extreme hot and cold temperatures
- DO NOT let anyone else play your instrument, it is your responsibility
- DO NOT lift your instrument by the keys
- If you have a problem with your instrument or if you think it is broken, bring it back to your music teacher at school and DO NOT try to get it repaired yourself. Alternatively contact our instrument warehouse team at lmsinstruments@lancashire.gov.uk for advice.
- Practice at home. By playing your instrument a little each day you will make good progress and keep your instrument in good working order.
- To help you practice you can log in to lancashiremusicserviceinteractive.co.uk. You will find this information in your practice diary.

Following these guidelines will ensure that you have great fun playing your instrument.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

INFORMATION RELATING TO PERSONAL INJURY, ELECTRICAL SHOCK AND FIRE HAZARD

This keyboard should only be connected to the power adapter supplied with the keyboard.

This keyboard should be disconnected from the mains power supply when left unused for extended periods of time.

This instrument is not designed to be used in wet/damp locations and should not be used near water or exposed to rain.

Care should be taken that objects do not fall and liquids are not spilled onto the keyboard.

This keyboard is capable of producing sound levels that could cause hearing loss. Do not operate for a long period of time at a high volume level.

Do not attempt to service this instrument.

This keyboard should not be used and returned to the school for servicing if:

1. The power adapter has been damaged
2. Objects have fallen, been inserted, or liquids have been spilled into the keyboard
3. It has been exposed to rain
4. It does not operate, exhibits a marked change in performance
5. It has been dropped, or the enclosure damaged
